



CRUCIFISURRECTION

The greatest (2) days in history







"Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him."

What is their response?




"Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid."



They still think it is the end


Question through the whole of Mark's gospel: "What do you choose to believe?

This is not the beginning - the Gospel plan has been in progress since the Garden of Eden.


This is the beginning of the end - a glorious triumphant victorious end when Jesus returns and sickness and death are finally conquered.

Two challenges we face:




Triumphalism. The assumption that all of the future promises are here already.

Cross-limited living:


We still live in Mark 15

Crucifisurrection living:


The sacrifice of the cross and the power of the resurrection

Reaching in faith for the fulness of new life

Picking up our cross daily.

Standing at the foot of the cross - and then going beyond the empty tomb.

FULL REALITY
